On Wednesday an information evening was held for the Year 10, 2018 Careers and Transition class. This is an initiative implemented into Concord High School by the transition coordinator, Ms Peoples and was trialled in 2018. The program was evaluated this year and shown to be highly successful in meeting all of the projected outcomes. As a consequence this course is included in the timetable for Year 10, 2018.

The aim of the program is to engage a select group of year 10 students into a personalised and flexible alternate program of study for year 10 in a collaborative and engaging environment. Students have individualised learning plans which identify and support future study options, work and life goals. The students are paired with one of the CaTS teachers who will be their mentor for the year. The course develops life and employability skills and exposes students to a variety of career pathways and opportunities.

## Head Start program

One of the schools strategic outcomes for the 2018-2020 school plan is to engage community. Traditionally we have always linked with and fostered positive relationships with our feeder primary schools to ensure the smooth transition of the primary students into high school. We do this through high level communication, and specialised programs such as Head Start. This is a 5 week program where students from the local primary schools attend each Monday morning for a range of extension programs.

All policies and procedures were followed correctly to ensure the safety of students and teachers at Concord High School. ## White Ribbon Day

Today at school we celebrated White Ribbon Day. Miss Patulny (Girls' Adviser) and Mr White (Boys' Adviser), along with a number of students, were involved in the promotion of this very important day.

So, what is White Ribbon Day?

In 1999, the United Nations General Assembly declared November 25, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women (IDEVAW) and the White Ribbon has become the symbol for the day.

The White Ribbon Campaign is the only national violence prevention campaign, and it is unique in that it aims to raise awareness amongst Australian men and boys about the roles they can play to prevent violence against women. The campaign calls for men across Australia to speak out and take an oath. An oath never to commit, excuse or remain silent about violence against women. The campaign culminates on White Ribbon Day (25 November) each year, when men and women across Australia are called to wear a white ribbon or wristband as a visual symbol of their commitment and oath.

In wearing a white ribbon, men and boys can act as positive role models and advocates for change by challenging behaviors and attitudes that have allowed violence against women to occur.

The campaign continues to go from strength to strength and now boasts more than 1000 White Ribbon Ambassadors Australia wide, as well as more events across the country and more organisations and individuals participating year upon year.

#### **KOKODA TRAIL MEMORIAL SERVICE**

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> November

On Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> November, Esra, Georgina, Paul and I had the great honour of representing Concord High School at the Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway to remember an important part of Australian history – The Battle of Kokoda. This date is set aside to remember the valiant soldiers who fought in the Battle of Kokoda as part of the Pacific War during World War II against Japanese aggression. The Kokoda campaign consisted of a series of battles fought between July and November, 1942 in what was then the Australian Territory of Papua.

During this service we were reminded of our historical past, the value of the present and the importance of the future. We were reminded of the fallen soldiers who had given up their tomorrow for our today. It was also poignant to hear the traditional songs of the descendants of the Fuzzy Wuzzy Angels who aided Australian soldiers in this battle. We were further privileged to see many highly decorated war veterans pay their respects to their fallen brethren in a wreath laying ceremony. The prefects were also provided with the opportunity to lay a wreath and pay our respects to the brave individuals who put their lives on the line for the sake of their country and our future. The ultimate sacrifice these Australians made for the glorious country we live in today shall never be forgotten.

#### **REMEMBRANCE DAY SERVICE**

Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> November

At the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month, 1918, the guns of the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. The Axis Powers accepted Allied terms, which resulted in an armistice and a surrender that saw the conclusion of fighting on the battle front. Each year Australians take part in a minute's silence, in memory of those who died and

On the 30<sup>th</sup> August, twenty Year 9 and 10 students volunteered to raise funds for the Legacy Foundation; an organisation that supports the families of disabled and deceased veterans.
