On Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> June both Year 7 and Year 9 students were presented with Police Talks from our local Burwood Police Community. As a part of our Welfare program students were educated on how to be proactive and safe online. Please note at recess (10:35am – 10:55am) and lunch (12.35pm – 1.15pm) students are given priority – parents welcome after recess and before or after lunch.

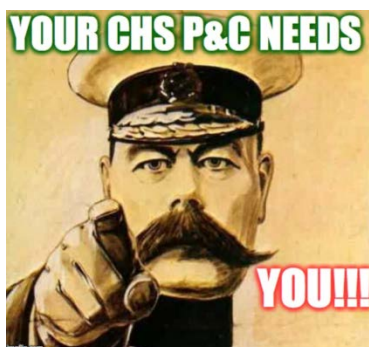
If students are interested in purchasing tracksuit pants, please contact Mae.

Your P&C needs the people with the following skills from the community to help support our school and ongoing fundraising initiatives.

#### **Annual Auditor**

Accurate financial record keeping is important in any organisation, especially for a not-for-profit association like the P&C. We require a *pro bono* auditor. The auditor does not need to be a member of the Institute of Internal Auditors (IIA) nor a qualified professional but he/she must possess appropriate skills and experience in auditing and financial record management together with an appreciation of the issues of probity as they relate to the role of an association auditor. The auditor must not have or appear to have any conflict of interest arising, for example, from a personal or business relationship with an Officer of the association and must be prepared to swear that the records are a true and correct statement of the information provided by the Treasurer. This is a once a year role but is a critical role for our compliance and we are hoping someone from the local school community will be able to help us. You will work closely with the Treasurer.

#### **P&C Representatives on New Staff Merit Selection Panels**

Another important way of being involved is to sit as a P&C representative on a Merit Selection Panel for new staff.
