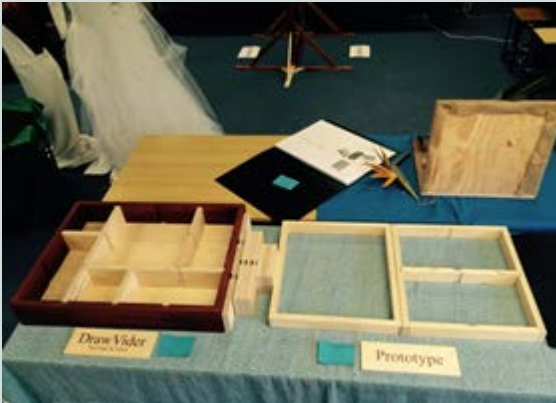

Technological and Applied Studies News

Year 9 Electronics Technology

In the Technological and Applied Studies Faculty we offer a range of elective courses to nurture as many student interests as possible. Our year 9 electronics technology class has worked on some introductory projects involving the construction of simple circuits, the use of resistors and capacitors, the direction of current and basic electronics theory such as Ohm's Law. It is an interesting course which is safe and easy to complete practical work because we do not initially use soldering irons – instead springs and special work boards which allow us to configure circuits.

Now that the students are familiar with circuits they are building their own circuits, soldering the wiring to the components and using timber baseboards with nails to support the materials. Our term project has been to design and build skills testers. A skills tester is a wire shape that you move another circular wire along without touching. If you touch the wires together an alarm rings. The circuit itself is quite simple but making the platform, concealing the electronics and making the finished project look aesthetically pleasing is all part of the design process. Recently, we have acquired 3D printers and we are going to incorporate a plastics component into this project. I would like the boys to be familiar with using and integrating all technologies together into one project.

In week 10, the students will set up a skills tester challenge on tables near the canteen and charge students 20 cents to "test their skill". The class decided, as young men, that the money raised should be donated to a men's health charity.

Sherlock Holmes Excursion

The Year 9 Electronics Technology students attended the Sherlock Holmes Interactive exhibit to examine the role of electronics in presentation, display and the quality of our entertainment. Electronics alone is really just wires and components. It is not until an application in the real world is found for our skill that it becomes valuable. Portable Nintendo games exemplify this.

The Sherlock Holmes Interactive exhibition displayed some very simple technologies such as etching on paper but used a range of complex electronics to present the exhibit. Computer controlled lighting, sensors starting digital media activated by the movement of people and displays set up to give clues to solve the Sherlock Holmes mystery were all dependent on the circuitry behind the scenes.

I want to congratulate the boys for their efforts during the term.

Year 12 Major Design Technology Projects

The HSC markers came to Concord High School this week to mark year 12 Design and Technology Major Design Projects. The Design course requires students to identify a problem or design situation and construct a product, system or environment to solve that problem. In addition they must submit a folio documenting the design process that they have undertaken. The project accounts for 60% of the final mark while the examination makes up the remaining 40%.

This year we have had some very successful students complete this course. Major projects include, timber covered exercise books held together with magnets, a collapsible skateboard, a lighting and air conditioning sensor activated by human movement and able to save huge amounts of energy, a new type of men's watch with special high range lighting, a collapsible bed light that attaches to any surface and a doggy lookout so that dogs can see out of apartment windows without jumping up damaging the walls.

As part of a major study the students have to propose how they would commercialise this product by first patenting the design, marketing it and producing it ethically using suitably sourced materials and fair labour hire. This is a complex project requiring deep thought and analysis

As a teacher it is quite amazing to have a class of students with all different ideas about what they want to design and then facilitating the production process.

I would like to congratulate all of the Design and Technology students for their hard work over the last 12 months. They should be very proud of their work.

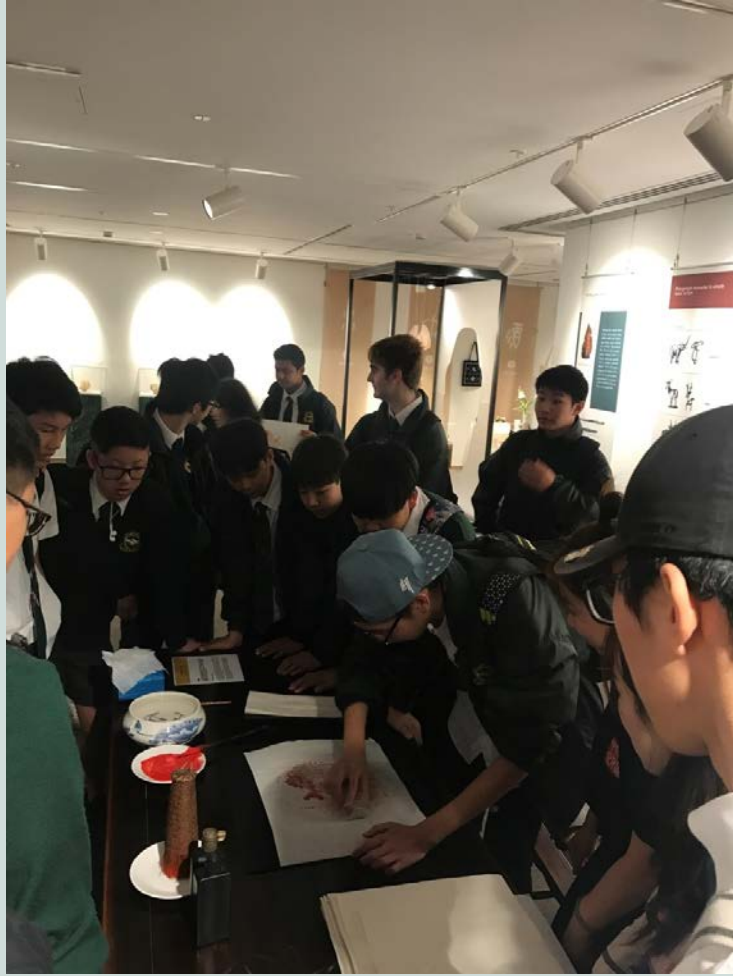
