### **Principals Report**

It has been another wonderful week of learning and engagement at Concord High School. I am most impressed with the effort that students are making in ensuring that they follow the uniform policy and follow the three core PB4L values: respectful, responsible, achievers.

#### **UNIFORM**

I have included a copy of the uniform requirements of the school for your information below. Can I please clarify that students are requested to wear black, closed in leather shoes for WHS reasons.

Just a reminder that Concord High School is a uniform school, as decided by the school community. All uniform items are to be purchased from the uniform shop only. Any student who is out of uniform must follow these procedures:

- Bring a note of explanation signed by a parent/guardian
- Hand the note to the Side Office administration staff before school •
- A uniform slip will be issued
- A lunchtime detention will occur for any students out of uniform

Any student who is out of uniform without a note will be recorded and issued a slip. This will incur a lunchtime detention. The third infringement will lead to a letter home and further consequences.

- Junior knee-length check skirt in charcoal grey, green and gold OR
- Senior knee-length pin-striped skirt in charcoal grey, green and gold OR
- Charcoal grey trousers
- White crew socks (summer)
- Black stockings (winter) to be worn underneath school skirt (no sports tights)
- White blouse with piped, rounded collar and school emblem
- V-necked knitted jumper with emblem OR
- Sleeveless green knitted vest with emblem
- Optional charcoal grey scarf
- Optional green blazer with emblem
- Optional school charcoal grey cap with school initials (caps are not to be worn indoors)
- Black leather lace-up shoes (closed-in, hard leather no joggers)
- Optional all-weather jacket


#### Boys

- Charcoal grey shorts OR
- Charcoal grey trousers
- White crew socks
- White shirt with school emblem
- School tie (terms 2 and 3)
- Green V-neck knitted jumper with emblem OR
- Sleeveless green knitted vest with emblem
- Optional green blazer with emblem
- Optional charcoal grey scarf
- Optional school charcoal grey cap with school initials (caps are not to be worn indoors)
- Black leather lace-up shoes (closed-in, hard leather no joggers)
- Optional all-weather jacket

### Sports Uniform (Unisex)

- Black PE shorts with school emblem
- Yellow polo shirt with school emblem
- White crew socks
- Runners
- School tracksuit with school emblem
- Representative sporting members may wear school tracksuit top when representing the school at sporting events

N.B. Students should come to school in school uniform each day and change for sport or PE

- Minimal jewellery (watch, small earrings, flat ring, chain necklace worn inside blouse)
- Makeup is unnecessary at school

#### Lunch time activities at Concord High School

#### YEAR 12 COURSES

At this time of year, many Year 12 students are considering making changes in their courses (reduction in units or levels etc). It is important that these decisions are made in a considered way as the implications of dropping one course may be that another course later causes more issues and any changes cannot be undone! As a result, no changes will be made without the student having an interview with the Deputy.

It is also often very wise to have a "buffer" with more than the minimum number of units being studied. Each student's needs will be assessed and decisions made on a case by case basis. Where a student has had changes approved, a new timetable will be issued. Students should not "assume" that they will be dropping a course until it has been approved. Students will not be allowed to drop a subject where they have outstanding N Warnings.

#### **STUDENT LEAVE**

Please note that all leave should be restricted to holiday periods.

Leave will not be approved during assessment periods (eg. mid-course or yearly examinations).



### **Welfare News**

The Vaccination Program is running again this year for Years 7, 10 and 11. The dates were published in last week's KIT, below is some additional information for parents:

#### NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2018 the following vaccines will be offered:

YEARS	VACCINE	NUMBER OF DOSES
	Human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2-doses at least 6 months apart
Year 7	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine	Single dose
Years 10-11	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose

*Parent Information Kits* that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive
- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Please note that students who commence HPV vaccination in school clinics in Year 7 but do not complete the course during the school year may be offered catch-up doses at school in Year 8. Students who have any HPV doses at their GP will be advised to complete the course with their GP.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at <u>www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation</u>.

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form (within 1 business day). Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.
