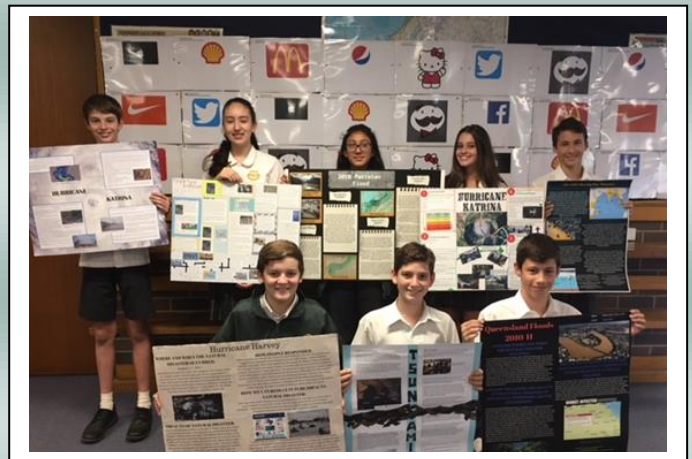
Year 8 Geography The Water World Project
