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# **Principal's Report**

## Student Pastoral Care and Wellbeing - 2020

As the year draws to an end it gives me great pleasure to be able to outline to all our Concord High families the changes that are planned for 2020. These changes have been developed throughout this year with the following underlying principles in mind:

- 1. At Concord High School our guiding principle is that every student and every staff member is known, valued and cared for to achieve their full potential, within a culture of high expectations.
- 2. Our year groups have become consistently above 200 students in each year and we acknowledge a greater level of support and resource is required to support our students.
- 3. We believe that making a successful transition from primary school to high school is a key time in the lives of young people where additional support is required.
- 4. We believe that young people learn best when they are active participants in their own learning and deeply engaged with the school through quality learning experiences and leadership opportunities.

To support these underlying principles the following initiatives have been put in place in preparation for next year.

### Year 7 Middle School

A curriculum structure designed to support a positive transition for students from Year 6 into Year 7

- Classes taught by no more than 6 specialist teachers
- An innovative staffing arrangement designed to minimise the need for casual teachers
- Integrated and connected teaching units
  - o Humanities English, History, Literacy taught together as part of a connected curriculum
  - o STEM Mathematics, Science, Numeracy taught as part of a connected curriculum
  - Health Physical education, Health education, Sport taught as part of a connected curriculum
- A range of innovative student voice and student leadership programs commencing in Year 7 next year
- Each class supported by a teacher who will fill the role of Class Mentor First line of learning and wellbeing support, who will be in contact with your child every day, supporting learning goals and feedback on learning progress
- Year group supported through a "wrap around" wellbeing structure that includes
  - Deputy Principal Year 7 Supporting the mainstream
  - Head Teacher Learning and Wellbeing Supporting students with additional needs
  - Head Teacher Welfare
  - Year 7 Co-advisers
  - o Teacher Mentors dedicated to each class
  - o Peer Support Leaders and Class Wellbeing Support from Senior Students

#### Head Teacher Student Leadership Role

We have created an additional Head Teacher role for next year. Following a very keenly contested merit selection process, I am pleased to announce to the Concord Community that Alysha Peoples has been successful in this role. The focus of Alysha's position will be to lead opportunities for students in all year groups to play an active leadership role at the school. She will be particularly active in designing a student leadership model for students in Year 7 – 2020.



# **Principal's Report**

### **School Nurse**

We have made a commitment to the employment of Lorraine Bechara R.N. on a full time basis next year. Lorraine's role will be around the triage of students with physical and mental health concerns, attending to serious physical injuries, supporting families to access medical support for their children in the community, liaising with medical health professionals who are treating students at our school, ensuring that all students have health care plans where needed, and supporting the school with a range of health education initiatives. Lorraine has been working at the school this year on a part-time basis.

### **In-built Relief Model**

We have recognised that teaching and learning is at its best when students are taught by teachers who know them well. For that reason we have intentionally left our Year Advisers and Head Teachers underload on their timetables for next year. This means that when a classroom teacher is absent from school due to illness or other commitments, these staff members who are known to the students are in a position to step in and take this class.

It is our belief that minimising our need for day-to-day casual relief in the school will significantly improve student/teacher interactions and maximise learning in our classrooms.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Deputy Principal Role

I am pleased to advise that Danka Milinovic will continue in the Acting Deputy Principal role in 2020. I believe that with in excess of 200 students in each year group, that 2 year groups is the maximum that any of the Deputies can effectively manage, on top of their educational leadership roles. Next year the following arrangements for student support are in place: Jody Engisch : Year 8 and 11 Craig Anderson : Year 7 and 9 Danka Milinovic : Year 10 and 12

#### Senior Executive as Instructional Leaders

Next year all members of the Senior Leadership Team (including myself) will teach a class. Allowing for maximum engagement with teaching and learning, together with the opportunity to support faculty and whole school policies and procedures.

A reminder that our Presentation Night will be held on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> December. I look forward to seeing as many families as possible on the night.

Aoife Collins and Hannelore Pusenjak are active members of the CHS EnviroClub through which they have been keen advocates for environmental initiatives.

As a result of their continual interest and motivation on sustainable practices and reducing human impact on the environment they were successful in the application of the Lizard Island Coral Reef Study Tour in 2020. The Lizard Island Coral Reef Study Tour is an immersive, live-in educational experience in coral reef science on the Great Barrier Reef led by marine scientists and representatives from the Australian museum. Aoife and Hannelore will represent Concord High School between the 10th - 19th April, 2020.

This is a huge achievement as this highly competitive program that was available to all year 11 students studying stage 6 Biology at NSW government schools, with only 16 places available.

The full cost of this pilot program is \$4000 per person, covered by the Lizard Island Reef Research Foundation.

**FIRST LEGO League (FLL)** is an international competition organized by *FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology)* for upper-primary and lower-middle school students.

Each year in August, FIRST LEGO League introduces a scientific and real-world challenge for teams to focus on and research. The robotics part of the competition involves designing and programming LEGO Mindstorms robots to complete tasks. The students work out a solution to a problem related to the theme which changes every year and then meet for regional, national and international tournaments to compete, share their knowledge, compare ideas, and display their robots.



The team of robotics club in Concord High School this year is amazing! They have worked so hard together every day especially this term before the competition. Their unity, collaboration and the exciting spirit of team work were recognized in the regional FLL competition and they won the teamwork award as the best team in the competition!

This group of Year 7 students have set a few first time records. They represented Concord High School and participated in the Robocup Junior competition this year the first time. There are more girls in the club this year than ever. Amazingly, they won an award in FLL regional for Concord High School the first time! I am so proud of them!

The competition was challenging, full of fun and inspirational. Importantly, the team had a great time. They are already looking forward to next year!
