Who Do I Contact at Concord High School?

Parents and Caregivers may not always be aware who the best person is to contact when they have a concern or need to share information about their child.

It is best to ring the school's number (9745 3777) and the office staff will take a message and send it to the specific person via an email message. Staff are asked to check their emails once a day, which is normally before school. So a message left one day may not be returned until the following day.

It is often not possible to meet with parents, who have not booked an appointment. All staff have teaching responsibilities and this is their primary responsibility. Please ring first.

Year 10 subject selection process.

We look forward seeing you on Wednesday 26th May at 6pm in the school hall. There will be a brief presentation about the rules of the HSC and then we will ask that you speak to faculty representatives to confirm the subject choices that you and your student are intending.

Following the evening you will receive an email with a code for Edval to make a final selection of courses.

There will be a pause in steps from here as this data will then be analysed and the school timetable for 2022 will start to be constructed. In this process some courses may not be able to run and students will be matched to the reserve subjects. It is important that all courses are ones the student would like to study and also is demonstrating ability to study.

Year 8 evaluation

At the end of last year we asked families of Year 7 to contribute to an evaluation of the Year 7 Middle school program. The final part of this evaluation is to ask similar questions to Year 8 students and families to reflect on the year from a new perspective. Thank you in anticipation of your contribution again this year.

Improving student school performance.

There has been a focus this year on students having a class workbook and requiring them to write more by hand. The HSC is still a pen and paper examination so we need to ensure students have the writing ability in time limits to be able to demonstrate their knowledge.

As a parent you can make a vital contribution to this success. The skills of a successful senior student are developed over time and include things like regularly reviewing class work, submitting drafts of work for the teacher to provide feedback and then applying that feedback to the work, time management in meeting deadlines and also preparing for deadlines. Even taking pride and care with bookwork complete, books covered and work finished off at home. The common rely to your question 'Do you have any homework?" Is going to be a 'no'.

Can you start to regularly look at your student's school books and encourage them to always try to do their best? You might ask them to paste in handouts, rewrite something taking slightly more pride in the quality of the work, reviewing spelling etc. We are trying to encourage students to do their best and not wait for some magic time when "I will work when it counts". Every year counts.
